Our current needs include a variety of items to be used in our daily ministry:

- Bleach

- Quick oats, grits, Cream of Wheat
- Instant coffee

- Cough drops
- Cold medicine (tablets or capsules)
- Twin-blade razors
- Shaving cream
- Bar soap
- Body wash/3-in-1 soap
