

Making plans to leave a legacy

We're thankful for supporters who have told us of their plans to make a legacy gift. This is a type of gift that anyone can make, because it is unique to each individual. The amount, type of gift, and method of giving is determined by you based on what is best for you and your family — this is a gift made in your own way.

In almost every newsletter, we share at least some information about leaving a legacy. What exactly is a legacy gift, and why is it so important?

A legacy gift is planned during your lifetime and made after death, after your family's needs are met and other expenses are covered. This type of gift allows you to provide ongoing support to a cause that you care about; you are choosing to leave a legacy that honors God by committing a portion of your estate to further God's work through the ministry of Lima Rescue Mission.

These gifts have a significant impact, and can help provide long-term financial stability. There are times when donations may be lower, expenses are higher due to serving more people, or unplanned repairs need to be made. It is during these times that gifts which were made previously and set aside in savings are used to cover current expenses. Legacy gifts also allow us to complete special projects and improvements, and may be set aside for future ministry growth.

There are a variety of ways to

make a legacy gift, and a financial planner or attorney can help determine the best method of giving for you. Some individuals have named us in their will, either to receive a fixed amount or percentage of an estate. Others have set up accounts as transfer on death.

A transfer on death account has multiple benefits; the most important is that these accounts avoid probate. The money you intend to give us is given directly to us, without overhead expenses or legal delays.

Transfer on death accounts can include checking, savings, IRA's, mutual funds, or other investment accounts. In most cases, you can contact a financial institution directly to set up transfer on death. You can name multiple

beneficiaries, and make changes to them at a later date without the need to update your will.

With this type of account, beneficiaries will need to contact the financial institution to receive their disbursement, so be sure to inform them that they are a beneficiary, either directly or by your attorney after your passing.

We know that a legacy gift is a serious decision, and we trust that you will prayerfully consider what is best for you. We are so thankful for these gifts over the years, which have provided a solid financial footing and allow us to continue reaching others with the message of God's love. A legacy gift can provide life transforming care for years to come.



The Impact of Legacy Gifts

Throughout Lima Rescue Mission's history, legacy gifts have provided significant support for our ministry to the homeless and less fortunate, ensuring that we are able to provide care to others well in to the future.

Lasting impact

Our Camp Roberts ministry to inner-city youth was started in 1975 through generous bequests. Over 40 years later, thousands of children have been introduced to God's Word because of those legacy gifts.

Projects and improvements

Legacy gifts have allowed us to complete major projects and improvements that would not have been possible otherwise.

Financial stability

Legacy gifts provide financial stability for daily ministry, especially during times when we are serving more people, or when there are unforeseen expenses.

Future investment

These gifts also allow us to save funds that may be used for future ministry growth.

2019 Statistics and summary

For the second year in a row, we saw a decrease in the number of meals and shelter provided. We provided 16,574 meals (4% decrease), 5,663 nights of lodging in our overnight shelter (9% decrease), and saw 164 men turn to us seeking help for the first time (3% increase).

Some fluctuations are normal throughout the year, both for meals and shelter. There may be times when only a handful are staying in our overnight shelter, and other times that we have to use an overflow space. Despite the sometimes unpredictable swings, we continue to focus on working with every individual—evaluating needs, determining the best ways to help, and setting achievable goals.

Tribute gifts

Making a donation in memory or honor of someone is a great way to pay tribute to that person. A memorial gift is a thoughtful way to remember a friend or loved one, and a gift in honor of someone is a unique opportunity to celebrate a birthday, anniversary, graduation, or other special event.
